Wells Tannery Man Killed in Accident

Roy W. Shaw, 57, of Wells Tannery, suffered fatal injuries in an automobile accident at Hustontown at 2:55 P. M. on Monday of this week.

Driving a 1953 Studebaker, Mr. Shaw was travelling east on Route 76 when his car ran off the road on the right side as he was rounding a turn. The car then swerved back onto the road and skidded into a tree on the left side.

Taken to the Fulton County Medical Center in the House ambulance, he was pronounced dead on arrival.

His injuries included a crushed chest and multiple lacerations of the scalp and hip.

Dr. R. C. McLucas, county coroner, stated that in view of the existing injury to the chest, which was penetrated by the steering post, he did not feel an autopsy would reveal whether or not an immediate pre-existing heart attack had taken place. However, Mr. Shaw was known to have a moderately severe heart disease.

Born on June 25, 1900, at Three Springs, RD, he was a son of William H. and Viola Sipe Shaw. On September 18, 1923, he married Wealthy Foster at Hollidaysburg.

Mr. Shaw had been employed as a blacksmith by the Pennsylvania Railroad. He retired ten years ago and he and his wife settled in Wells Valley.

Survivors include the following sisters and brothers: Mrs. Hazel Swope of Wells Tannery, Orville Shaw of Harrisburg, Mrs. Olive McClain and Clyde Shaw of Youngstown, Ohio, Mrs. Marie Black of Duncansville, Robert Shaw of Wells Tannery and Mrs. Della Black of Waterfall.
